We continue to receive questions, almost every day, from healthcare professionals and potential clients, about how the Aphasia Center of California is doing, and how we've adapted to providing online aphasia programs. Healthcare professionals are extremely interested to learn how we've managed to successfully transition all of our aphasia services online. Potential clients and families are wondering if meeting on a computer screen really works.

We've learned that providing online aphasia services requires having talented speech-language pathologists with both the experience and flexibility to adapt to the changes that a virtual environment brings. In addition to these weekly groups, ACC volunteers Katelyn Eng and Azlynda Alim are hosting a monthly Family Game Night for people with aphasia and family members. Family Game Night combines friendly competition, language practice, and plenty of fun!

We've learned that assisting people to get (and stay) connected online requires having available technological support from someone who really knows "aphasia." That's become an added part of my job description—I have been assisting all new ACC members with any software or hardware challenges and also respond to daily "technology support" calls from existing members. I'm convinced that providing this level of support is one of the reasons that the ACC's online programs have been so successful.

When I'm not assisting current or new participants with technology challenges, an important part of my job is fielding inquiries from people needing information and referral services related to aphasia. The ACC is committed to helping family members and stroke survivors from around the country, and most recently even internationally, navigate the confusing maze of rehabilitation options.

Social connection is vitally important for all human beings, but perhaps no more than for those who are living with aphasia, especially during a pandemic! For the past 25 years, the Aphasia Center of California has become an international model, through its programs, research, presentations, and publications that demonstrate how important aphasia groups are for reducing isolation and improving communication skills. 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
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
